Also, **if you worked for the same employer in another state or were rehired within 2 months**, your initial employment counts toward your 120 days.

HOW DO I EARN PAID SICK TIME?

Employees earn 1 hour of paid sick time for every 30 hours of work. For example, if you worked at least **36** hours per week since 5/11/2026 you likely would have earned hours by 9/8/2026 and **the more time you work, the more sick time you will earn and be eligible to use.** Employers may have policies that allow employees to earn or use more sick time, and generally **employers must allow workers** who have earned 72 or more hours of sick time to **use at least 72 hours of paid sick time each year.**

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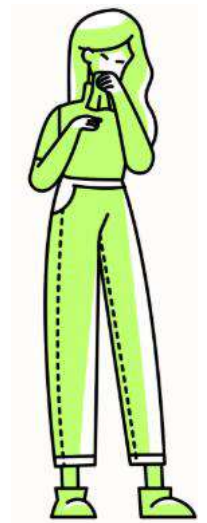

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Employees in Michigan, who have been employed for at least **120 days**, must be allowed to use **earned** paid sick time. For example, if you started working on **4/20/2026** (which is the first day of **H-300-26038-626550**), then beginning **8/18/2026** you can start using the paid sick time you have already earned. Some employers may permit employees to use sick time *prior* to completing 120 days of employment. Also, **if you worked for the same employer in another state or were rehired within 2 months**, your initial employment counts toward your 120 days.

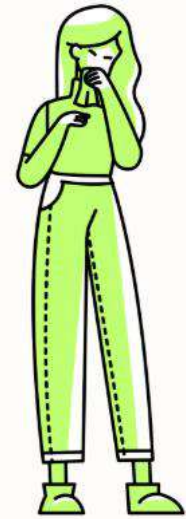
