For example, if you started working on **3/1/2026** (which is the first day of **H-300-25351-490164**), then beginning **6/29/2026** you can start using the paid sick time you have already earned. Some employers may permit employees to use sick time *prior* to completing 120 days of employment. Also, **if you worked for the same employer in another state or were rehired within 2 months**, your initial employment counts toward your 120 days.

HOW DO I EARN PAID SICK TIME?

Employees earn 1 hour of paid sick time for every 30 hours of work. HOW DOES IT WORK?

Once you know you need to use sick time, tell your employer. Your employer **cannot request** documentation, unless you use more than three (3) consecutive days; **cannot require** you to find coverage at work while you are out; and **cannot penalize** you for using your earned sick time. Your employer must **maintain confidentiality** of your reasons for taking time off and cannot disclose the information to anyone without your permission.

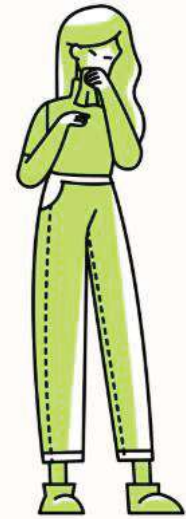
