COVID-19 Migrant Camp Rights

Last Updated July 2, 2020



Under <u>Executive Order 2020-137</u>, the Governor of Michigan has ordered migrant camp owners and operators do the following:

- <u>Create a COVID-19 preparedness and response plan</u> for camp residents.
- Follow the workplace protections in Section 1 of <u>Executive Order 2020-114</u>, although access to the camps should not be denied to any person on the basis that it's a worksite
- <u>Separate beds by at least 6 feet</u> when possible & encourage sleeping head-to-toe, except in single-family housing
- Share the local health department's phone number with residents.
- Post the Michigan Coronavirus hotline, 888-535-6136, for residents to make *confidential* complaints about unsafe conditions both in a central location and in any isolation housing
- Post the camp address both in a central location and in any isolation housing
- Post the name, phone number, and email of the camp superintendent(s) in a central location
- Request emergency contact numbers from residents.
- Follow Department of Health and Human Services infection control recommendations.

If a camp resident tests positive for COVID-19, or is suspected to have COVID-19, *camp owners and operators must*:

- <u>Arrange for evaluation by a medical provider</u> through the local health department or federally qualified health center.
- <u>Report to the local health department</u>, the name and address of any individual in the camp known to have or suspected of having a communicable disease
- When COVID-19 is suspected but not confirmed, <u>provide isolation housing</u> unless already in a one-family housing unit or in a family living unit where it is possible to effectively isolate within that unit.
- When COVID-19 is confirmed, <u>provide separate housing</u>, <u>dining</u>, <u>and bathroom facilities</u> from residents who are *not* COVID-19-confirmed.
- Ensure good ventilation (for example, by opening screened windows to let in fresh air) of suspected COVID-19 resident's rooms.
- Ensure that anyone who delivers food and water to isolated residents has appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (for example, a facemask/shield).

Executive Order 2020-137 is in effect through November 1st, 2020.
