

Feeling sick? You may be eligible for paid time off!

Employees in Michigan, who have been employed for at least **120 days**, must be allowed to use **earned** paid sick time. For example, if you started working on **3/23/2026** (which is the first day of **H-300-26022-582403**), then beginning **7/21/2026** you can start using the paid sick time you have already earned. Some employers may permit employees to use sick time *prior* to completing 120 days of employment. Also, **if you worked for the same employer in another state or were rehired within 2 months**, your initial employment counts toward your 120 days.

HOW DO I EARN PAID SICK TIME?

Employees earn 1 hour of paid sick time for every 30 hours of work. For example, if you worked at least **40** hours per week since 3/23/2026 you likely would have earned hours by 7/21/2026 and **the more time you work, the more sick time you will earn and be eligible to use.** Employers may have policies that allow employees to earn or use more sick time, and generally **employers must allow workers** who have earned 72 or more hours of sick time **to use at least 72 hours of paid sick time each year.**

WHAT QUALIFIES AS PAID SICK TIME?

Sick time can be used for your or your family member's mental or physical illness, injury, or health condition; including time off needed for any medical diagnosis, appointments, care, recovery, or treatment. It may also be used to obtain services related to domestic violence or sexual assault experienced by yourself or your family member. It can be used if your work closes due to a public health emergency, or if you need to care for a child whose school or place of care has been closed due to a public health emergency.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Once you know you need to use sick time, tell your employer. Your employer **cannot request** documentation, unless you use more than three (3) consecutive days; **cannot require** you to find coverage at work while you are out; and **cannot penalize** you for using your earned sick time. Your employer must **maintain confidentiality** of your reasons for taking time off and cannot disclose the information to anyone without your permission.

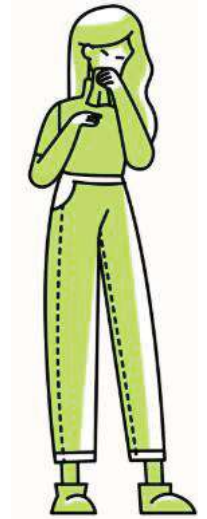
